Pupil Premium Impact Report: October 2015

Intervention or initiative: Pupil Premium Funding 2014 - 15

Background:

The school received £11,700 from the Local Authority in April 2014 to improve the outcomes for pupils who qualify for pupil premium. This funding is allocated to children from low-income families who are known to be eligible for free school meals, and children who had been looked after continuously for more than six months. Additionally, this funding also applies to children of service personnel.

Pupil Premium funding is intended to support the above groups of pupils in order to help them maximise achievement and the way in which we use this funding is influenced by educational research presented in the Sutton Trust report (2013) which reviewed the impact of key approaches on children's attainment.
