Impact of premium use	
Impact on pupils' participation:	<p>More opportunities for children with a wider range of sports due to working with cluster and local schools who are part of the Sports Partnership.</p> <p>The range of sports such as speed stacking has encouraged children who may not be enthused by more traditional sporting events. It also gives opportunities to try activities that may not be otherwise available. (Archery, football, dodge ball, netball, speed stacking etc.)</p> <p>Observations by the PE lead of lessons were positive.</p> <p>All pupils have opportunities including the vulnerable groups and careful selection allows targeted activities.</p> <p>All children had the opportunity to join in with a Lunch time Sports club, each week this alternated between the Key Stages.</p>
Impact on quality of PE teaching	<p>The use of specialist coaches gives additional high quality PE sessions alongside lessons taught by class teachers.</p> <p>Training opportunities give fresh ideas and keeps staff up to date. It also gives them the confidence to teach new skills in exciting and different ways.</p> <p>More opportunities to share aspects of training received will develop this further</p>
How the premium has allowed pupils to develop active lifestyles:	<p>PE is timetabled to ensure lessons are in place. Understanding of healthy living and how exercise impacts on the body is part of the taught curriculum both within PE sessions and in PSHE and Science lessons.</p> <p>More opportunities to participate mean that children have access to more regular clubs and different activities.</p> <p>The PE leader carefully considers upcoming events to ensure a balance and access across the age groups and those children with additional needs.</p>
How the school will sustain the improvements:	<p>We will continue to use provide CPD to school staff to sustain high quality PE lessons.</p> <p>NQT starting in September will be provided with extra CPD to support their development.</p> <p>Training to ensure staff are up skilled and have access to a wider range of PE courses so that across the school other sports can be introduced and practice reviewed. Training needs to be identified following analysis of findings from this year's work by PE leader.</p> <p>Funding set aside to allow local competition opportunities for all ages and to give a diverse range of sporting opportunities. Develop in school activities such as Young Leaders to develop healthy lifestyles with lunchtime activities.</p>
